Tulsa King-Season 1 Episodes 1-10 March 2022-September 2022

In March of 2022, I was hired on at a Location Production Assistant for the TV Series Tulsa King. Began as an assistant and was able to promote quickly to Assistant Location Manager. I was the closer for the run of the season and the unit manager for the Location Department as well. I handled closing duties and the daily/nightly duties on set as well as managing the Locations Assistant's job duties during pre-set, during filming and after filming.

Chickasaw Nation Lighthorse Police Department 2013-2022

In February of 2013, I returned to the Chickasaw Nation Lighthorse Police Department as a Newcastle Precinct patrol officer. I was able to attend the FBI Basic Crisis Negotiations class as a patrol officer and begin working as a negotiator. In Mid-2017, I was promoted to Sergeant in the Newcastle precinct. I began working with officers and the line of support to ensure the Chickasaw core values and mission statement were upheld alike. During this period, I was also a Field Training Officer/FTO and Weekly Supervisor for the field training program.

Chickasaw Nation Division of Commerce 2008-2013

In 2008, I joined the Newcastle Gaming Center as the Assistant Security Manager due to health issues with my child. Within six months in this position, I was promoted to the Security Manager where I remained until returning to the Lighthorse Police Department. As a Security Manager, I managed approximately 15 salary positions and 120 hourly employees. I ensured policy and procedure was followed for all departments within the facility as well as security. I managed the security budget and requests for security officers and necessary operating expenses throughout each fiscal year.

Chickasaw Nation Lighthorse Police Department 2006-2008

In July of 2006, I started with the Chickasaw Lighthorse Police Department at a Newcastle Precinct patrol officer. I was hired prior to the opening of the Riverwind Casino to help in coverage for the new facility.

As a patrol officer, I responded to calls for service in the Newcastle Precinct but also all other precincts as well. There were times when I was the only officer working in the entirety of the Chickasaw Nation. My job duties included but were not limited to enforcing federal, tribal and Oklahoma state law within the 13 counties of the Chickasaw Nation tribal boundaries.

Lindsay Police Department 2003-2006

In December of 2003, I began work at the Lindsay Police Department as a part time police officer. Primary job duties were to enforce Oklahoma state statutes and municipal codes and respond to calls for service. I became a full time officer in 2004 and was promoted to a K9 handler position.
